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Summary of Institution Mission and Student Achievement

Shiloh University equips students in their unique callings to serve and impact communities by providing online Christian higher education opportunities.

In the context of the institution's mission to provide Christian educational opportunities to adult learners from various economic, social, and regional backgrounds, Shiloh University uses both direct and indirect performance measures to evaluate student achievement. These measures include cohort retention and graduation rates, evaluation of student achievement of program learning outcomes, student surveys, and course completion rates.

Aggregated Institutional Data on Student Achievement

INSTITUTIONAL RETENTION RATE – 85%

INSTITUTIONAL GRADUATION RATE – 55%

METHODOLOGY

1. The institutional retention rate is based on an aggregation of students enrolled in the 2019-2020 academic year that returned to continue their studies in the following fall 2020 trimester.

The 2019-2020 cohort was 70 students. From this group of students: 5 students graduated, 10 students did not continue their studies, and 55 students continued into the Fall 2020 trimester.

2. The institutional graduation rate is based on an aggregation of students who graduated in the 2019-2020 academic year within 200% of the published length for their academic program. 200% of Shiloh University's published programs length for an associate degree is 4 years, a bachelor degree is 8 years, a master degree is 4 years, a master of divinity degree is 8 years, and a doctoral degree is 6 years.
